### The *Prestige*

- Liberian-owned, Bahamas registered, Greek-operated,
- built in 1976, 243 m long, 81,000 DWT
- single-hulled oil tanker of
- carrying 77,000 tons of 2 grades of HFO

### The Accident

- during a storm on 13 November 2002,
- one of the Prestige's 12 tanks burst in north-western Spain (off Galician Coast).

### The Refuge Refusal


- successive rejections from France, Spain and Portugal
- storm quickly deteriorating ship integrity
- ship split in half and sank on 19 November.

## 'Prestige' Accident Facts



### The Aftermath

- 77,000 m<sup>3</sup> of oil in the sea
- seabed pollution,
- 200 km of coastline contamination
- ecological impact (coral reefs, birds and sharks species)
- Impact on fishing industry and shellfish farming (offshore fishing suspended for six months)

#### The Costs

- removal and breakdown operation: €100 million
- 2013 court ruling:

368 million euros to the Spanish State, 145 million euros to the Spanish Region of Galicia 68 million euros to France







## Safety Island? Who would be interested?



In theory, all at risk of an oil pollution:

- **F** Ports (and local industries)
- F Coastal Regions (and local communities, fauna and flora)
- **F** Member States (national policies for safety, environment, transport)
- F European Commission (European policies, legislation)
- **F** IMO (international legislation)

### In practice:

- **F** Would legislation recognise or hinder this option?
- **F** Who would be ready to pay for it or contribute to part of the costs?
- **F** Why invest in occasionally needed infrastructures?







### Mutlipurpose?



Multipurpose infrastructure means

**F** same infrastructure used for different purposes at different times;

Fintegrated infrastructure used for a cluster of compatible/complementary purposes;

Multiplying possible activities multiplies the sources of funding:

F public interest (safety, environment, coastal defense, ...);

F private undertakings (maritime industries in leisure, energy, ...);

FPPP;


